DAILY ITINERARY

DAY 1 TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 18 USA TO FRANKFURT

4:30 PM meet at Washington/Dulles airport for check-in at Swissair counter. Depart from Washington on Swissair on our transatlantic overnight flight departing at 5:40 PM bound for Zurich, Switzerland. Enjoy your in-flight meals and movies! (D, S on flight)

DAY 2 WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 19 FRANKFURT TO RUDESHEIM

Morning arrival in Zurich airport. We change flights and depart Zurich on Swissair to Frankfurt, Germany, where we arrive at 1:15 PM. Upon arrival to Frankfurt airport, after customs and passport control, you will be met by your local ASD Cultural Exchange Tour Manager who will transfer you to the city center of Frankfurt where we will begin a Frankfurt Panorama City Sightseeing. Nicknamed "Mainhattan" because of its office-tower skyline, Frankfurt is Germany's financial and publishing center and has the country's main international airport. Frankfurt has a real cosmopolitan character as well as also being a historic city. The Romans were here and the German emperors were crowned in the Dom. The Old Town was obliterated by bombing, but something of its atmosphere remains around the cobbled square known as the Römerberg. Following our Frankfurt sightseeing, we will journey to the Rhine Gorge and the town of Rudesheim am Rhein. The little town is undeniably picturesque, with its half-timbered houses and the remains of fortifications. Taverns and wine bars line Rudesheim's famous main street, the Drosselgasse, and a former stronghold of then Bishops of Mainz now houses a wine museum. Weighing 32,514 kilograms (32 tons), the great Niederwald Monument, whose giant figure of Germania commemorates German unification in 1871, is found high up among the vineyards. Check-in at your hotel. After check-in, the remainder of the day is at leisure. (B, L on flights)

DAY 3 THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 20 RUDESHEIM - RHINE CRUISE - COLOGNE

Welcome to beautiful and exciting Rhine! Starting at 8:30 AM, today you will enjoy a morning tour of Rudesheim, and then continue with leisure Rhine River Cruise for a few hours along some of the most beautiful Rhine scenery you can imagine. As we cruise the River Rhine from Rudesheim to Sankt Goar we will see new spectacular sights at almost every bend. We will pass Pfalz, a small fortress on an islet in the middle of the River Rhine, which enabled the lords of Burg Gutenfels above Kaub to extract a toll on passing ships. It was begun in 1327 as a pentagonal tower. An outer wall with turrets and a bastion were later added, giving it the silhouette of a stranded ship. After disembarking our cruise at Sankt Goar we will board our private motor coach and see the Castle Rheinfels, situated high above St. Goar with a splendid view over the Rhine. Castle Rheinfels was begun in 1245 as a seat of the counts of Katzenelnbogen. In the 16th and 17th centuries, the medieval castle was extended into an enormous and virtually impregnable fortress complex by the landgraves of Hesse. It was captured by the French in 1796 and partially demolished, but remains impressive even as a ruin. We continue towards Cologne and stop at The Benedictine Abbey of Maria Laach, which stands beside a volcanically formed lake in an isolated setting of forests, meadows and fields. Built between 1093 and 1230, it is an outstanding example of the characteristic Romanesque style of the Rhineland, with its emphasis on picturesque effects. Fronting the six-towered church, in an arrangement unique in Christian architecture, is a beautiful courtyard – the Paradise. We continue to Cologne (Köln), where we expect to arrive to by mid-afternoon and go directly to our host club - KKHT Schwarz-Weiss 1920 e.V. for an evening of friendly tennis matches. Following our Friendship Tennis Exchange, we continue to our hotel in Cologne. (B)

DAY 4 FRIDAY SEPTEMBER 21 COLOGNE

Starting at 9:00 AM, we enjoy a morning Cologne Panorama City Sightseeing. Founded by the Romans as a frontier post on the west bank of the Rhine, Cologne went on to become medieval Germany's biggest city. After the obliteration of most of the historic center by wartime bombing, Cologne was rebuilt according to its medieval street pattern. Today it is one of the Germany's great metropolitan cities, a center of commerce, industry and culture. Its glorious, twin-towered Dom is one of Europe's great triumphs of Gothic architecture, while its heritage of Romanesque church architecture is incomparable. We will also enjoy some free time in the city center before we again continue to our host tennis club - KKHT Schwarz-Weiss 1920 e.V. We enjoy an afternoon and evening of friendly tennis matches followed by an evening dinner party co-hosted by our host club KKHT Schwarz-Weiss 1920 e.V and ASD Cultural Exchange. Late evening return to our hotel. (B, D)

DAY 5 SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 22 COLOGNE TO MUNICH VIA ROMANTIC ROAD

Following our breakfast, we depart at 8:30 AM and travel to Munich. We journey to Wurzburg, where we begin today's highlight – our drive along Germany's famous Romantic Road. The Romantic Road is a designated route, this scenic route running for 215 miles from the wine-producing country around Wurzburg to the Bavarian Alps. Along the route traveler encounters incredible cultural diversity and a good dose of medieval history at the many walled towns. The beautiful countryside is filled with farms, vineyards, rivers and streams. Our Romantic Road experience begins with a visit to Wurzburg. Once the seat of mighty prince-bishops, Wurzburg basks among the steep and sunny vine-clad slopes of the River Main. A university city, it is dominated by the great Marienberg Fortress, a complex of buildings which includes the Marienfrankisches Museum. The city center has numerous fine churches, but its outstanding building is the overwhelming Residenz, the sumptuous baroque palace built by the prince-bishops in the 18th century. Staggering in scale, it has the largest ceiling painting in the world and some of the most impressive gardens in Germany. Our next stop along the Romantic Road is Rothenburg ob der Tauber, perhaps the most perfectly preserved of all German historic towns. Rothenburg offers and experience of total enchantment to all who tread its cobbled streets and squares. The townscape changes at almost every step, a magical mixture of fine half-timbered houses, old towers and gateways, a ring of fortifications with a sentry walk and a magnificent town hall, half-Gothic, half-renaissance, with a tower offering incomparable views over the town's sea of red-tiled roofs. An old convent houses the town museum, the Reichsstadtmuseum. Far below the fortifications is the tranquil valley of the River Tauber, which is crossed by the intriguing Doppelbrücke (double bridge). Then on to Dinkesbühl. This little medieval town is one of the high points of the Romantic Road. Dinkesbühl partly owes its perfect state of preservation to its children, whose appeal to save the city from destruction succeeded in softening the heart of its besiegers in the Thirty Years War. The town walls, bastions and watchtowers are consequently still intact, as are its cobbled streets lined with superb high-gabled houses, of which the most spectacular is the three-storied Deutsches Haus. The Church of St. George is an excellent example of a Germans hall-church, with fan vaults and fine carving. We continue our journey along the Romantic Road and reaches Nördlingen. Together with Dinkesbühl and Rothenburg ob der Tauber, Nördlingen makes up the wonderfully preserved trio of picturesque medieval towns along the Romantic Road. The town is still completely encircled by walls fortified with towers, gateways and a walkway for sentries. Lined with old houses, all Nördlingen's roads lead to the market place, dominated by the town hall and the church of St. George, which has a superb, carved altarpiece dating from the mid-15th century. From here on we continue to Munich, with an early evening arrival. Balance of the evening is free to enjoy Munich. (B)

DAY 6 SUNDAY SEPTEMBER 23 MUNICH

Welcome to beautiful and exciting Munich! Starting at 9:00 AM, today you will enjoy a morning Munich City Panorama Sightseeing Tour highlighting the neo-Gothic Town Hall, the twin onion-topped Frauenkirche, the famed Marienplatz, the Olympic Stadium, Nymphenburg Palace – the Versailles of Bavaria – and

Theresienwiese, site of the famous Oktoberfest, and much more. Our sightseeing of Munich continues with a visit to the nearby-located Concentration Camp Memorial of the in-famous World War II concentration camp Dachau. After our visit to Dachau we continue direct to our host tennis club for an afternoon and evening of tennis. 2:00 PM arrival at Tennisclub Pasing where we will enjoy an afternoon and evening with friendly tennis matches, followed by a social get-together - a festive and traditional German dinner party! - Co-hosted by Tennisclub Pasing and ASD Cultural Exchange. After an evening of fun with our new German friends at Tennisclub Pasing, we return to our hotel. (B, D)

DAY 7 MONDAY SEPTEMBER 24 MUNICH

Morning free to relax and further explore and enjoy Munich on your own. 1:00 PM transfer to our host tennis club - Tennisclub Pasing. We will enjoy a few hours of inter-group play as well as late afternoon we will continue to play against their players for a few hours of continued Friendship Tennis Exchange. 7:00 PM return to our hotel and free time to refresh for evening dinner on your own. Tonight we suggest an evening dinner at Germany's most famous beerhall - Hofbrauhaus am Platz - an evening of traditional German "gemutlich". (B)

DAY 8 TUESDAY SEPTEMBER 25 MUNICH - GARMISCH PARTENKIRCHEN - NEUSCHWANSTEIN PALACE - INNSBRUCK - LINZ

8:30 AM morning departure from our hotel and our day excursion in the Bavarian Alps, Germany's most charming countryside. We will drive to the charming mountain resort of Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Germany's foremost winter resort, where we will enjoy a short sightseeing and some free time. Once separate communities, Garmisch and Partenkirchen were amalgated in 1935, the year before the Winter Olympic Games were held here. Now Germany's foremost winter resort, they retain something of their former village charm. We then continue to Neuschwanstein Palace, the most famous and extravagant of the fantasy castles of King Ludwig II of Bavaria, in a breathtaking Alpine setting on a spur surrounded by lakes and mountains! Its air of unreality, both inside and out, is in large due to having been built by a team of theater designers. They worked on the absurdly exaggerated towers, spires, gables and battlements from 1869 until the project was abandoned when the king was deposed in 1886. The interior they created is equally ornate and ostentatious. After our visit to Neuschwanstein Palace, we continue to Innsbruck, Austria. Innsbruck, the capital of the Tyrol is set in a lovely spot on the River Inn at the foot of the Karwendel Alps and retains a distinctive provincial charm, making it one of the most attractive cities of Alpine Europe. We leave Innsbruck and continue our Alpine drive to Linz, Austria, our home for tonight. Linz is the capital of Osttirol (East Tyrol), a slice of Tirol separated from the main body of the province by Italy and Land Salzburg. It lies between the Hohe Tauern massif and the Gross Glockner peak in the north, and the Gailtaler Alpen (Dolomites) in the south. The old town center is of great charm, with the Bruck Castle and the church of St. Andr  forming the main focus of interest. Enjoy your evening in Linz. (B)

DAY 9 WEDNESDAY SEPTEMBER 26 LINZ - GROSS GLOCKNER ALPINE ROAD - KITZBUHL - BERCHTESGARDEN - SALZBURG

Morning departure from Linz. Our morning journey begins with the spectacular Alpine road – Grossglockner Alpine Road. Although constructed in 1935, this spectacular Alpine road remains a technical feat of the first rank. The route connects the Salzach valley near Zell am See with Heiligenblut in Carinthia (30 miles), crossing the Hohe Tauern range at 7,966 feet. A side spur leads to the panorama terrace of Franz-Josef's H he, facing the Grossglockner, the highest peak in Austria. This road is by many known to be one of the most spectacular roads in the Alps! After our scenic drive along the Gross Glockner Alpine Road we continue to Kitzbuhel. Austria's

most popular winter resort retains the atmosphere of a Tyrolean village in its historic center, where old-style houses with projecting gables and painted exteriors vie for attention with products bearing Europe's most exclusive brand names. Our day in the Alps continue and our journey brings us once again passing over the border back in to Germany and the Bavarian Alps and our visit to Berchtesgarden, home of a sinister attraction – Hitler's Kehlsteinhaus, the dictator's infamous mountaintop retreat "Eagle's Nest", with stunning views and scenery of Bavaria's Alpine country. After our visit to Eagle's Nest, we return to Austria and continue direct to Salzburg, Austria. Balance of the evening at leisure in charming Salzburg, Austria's music city, home of Mozart and the famous Von Trapp Family from the movie Sound of Music. Free time for dinner on own, perhaps you want to try to enjoy dinner with the Sound of Music Show (dependent on availability and schedule). (B)

DAY 10 THURSDAY SEPTEMBER 27 SALZBURG SIGHTSEEING, ON TO VIENNA

Morning sightseeing of beautiful Salzburg. Starting at 9:00 AM we will enjoy a walking tour of Salzburg and see some of the highlights of this city of castles, horse-drawn carriages and church towers including the Domplatz with Salzburg Cathedral and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's birthplace. After our walking Salzburg Panorama City Sightseeing, we enjoy a few hours of free time to further explore Salzburg on own as well as free time for lunch. At 1:30 we meet up and depart by our private motor coach to our tennis host club in Salzburg – Tenniscamp Salzburg Bergheim – for an afternoon of friendly play against their members, followed by a social get together (no-host bar). Early evening we continue to Vienna, Austria's capital and once the capital of a great empire in central Europe. Late evening arrival - 10:00 PM - in Vienna. Check-in at our hotel. (B)

We will see the Gothic Stephansdom (Cathedral), the City Hall, the State Opera House, Hofburg Imperial Palace and Belvedere Palaces and Gardens. We will visit and tour the famous Schoenbrunn Palace. Today - starting at 4:00 PM - we have an afternoon and evening of Friendship Tennis Matches in Vienna with local players at one of Vienna's larger tennis clubs – TK Eden – followed by a social evening of food and fun co-hosted by TK Eden and ASD Cultural Exchange (no-host bar). Late evening return to our hotel. (B, D)

This evening we enjoy a festive traditional Heurigen dinner in Grinzing, with music and wine! We leave our hotel at 7:30 PM for our Farewell Dinner at the charming "Altes Presshaus", and return to our hotel after a fun evening in Grinzing. (B, D)
